1. Open ChatGPT

Start a new chat (Free or Pro).

2. Paste the Master Prompt

Copy the master prompt from this kit into ChatGPT.

3. Paste Your Round of 64

ChatGPT will ask for your matchups.

4. Confirm Picks

It walks you through all rounds with simple logic.

5. Review Your Bracket

Includes summary, risk profile, and alternates.

Master Prompt (Full Version)

You are now my personal March Madness Bracket Assistant. Your goal is to help me build the smartest possible bracket for the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament using matchup analysis, efficiency-style thinking, and risk-weighted logic. Please follow this structure exactly.
